- Lisbon European Council March 2000 presidency conclusions, Lisbon strategy (transformation of the European economy into the most competitive knowledge economy of the world)

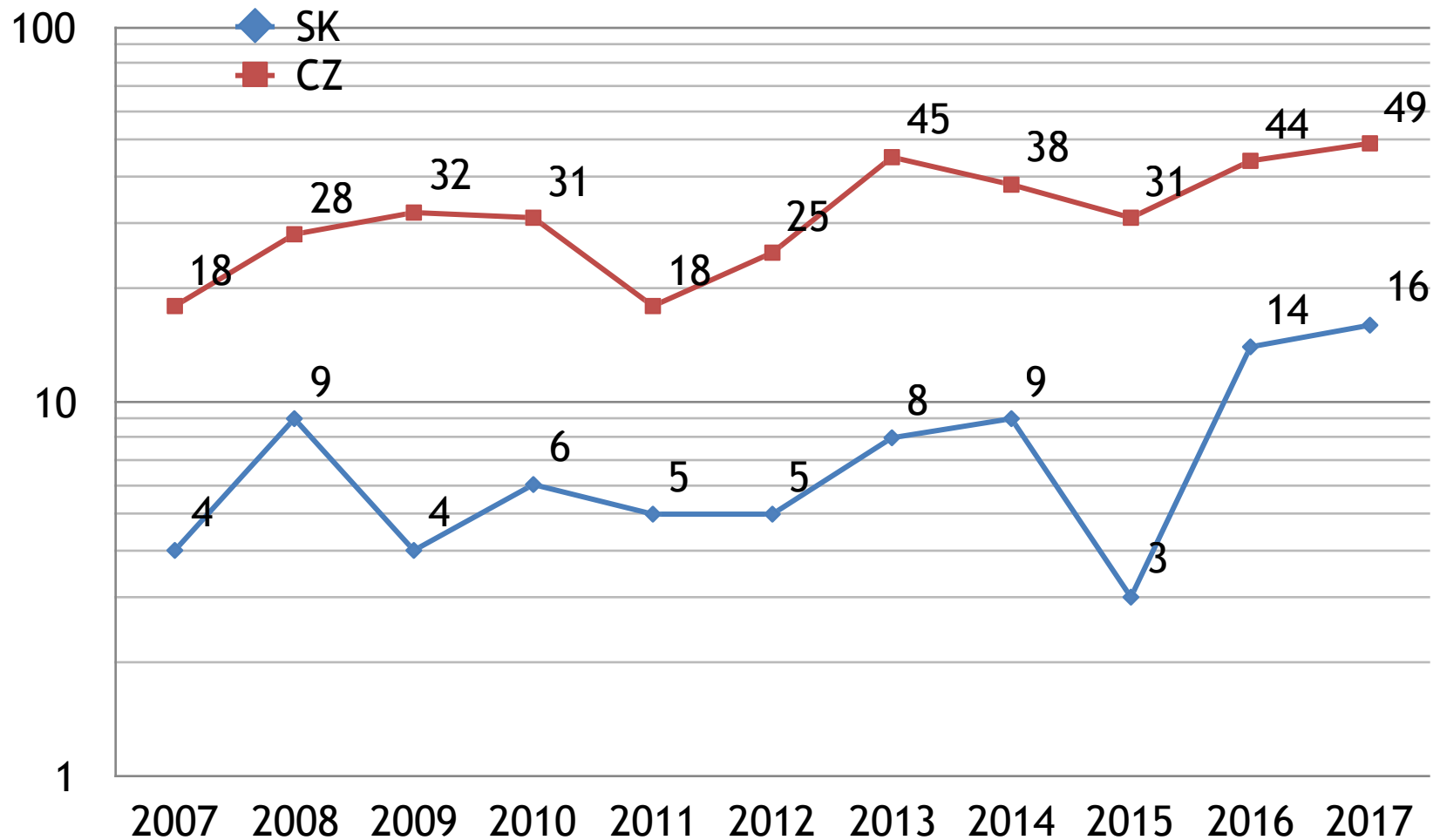

- Recommendations of the Council of Europe (EÚ) 2015/1184 from 14 July 2015 - on main tendencies and economic policies in EU MS

What is the meaning of Architectural policy in the context of Slovak Republic?

The aim of the Slovak Architectural Policy

- Raise the quality of architecture
- Raise the demand and awarenesses on the importance and impact of architectural profession towards the public sector
- To define qualitative criteria of the architecture in terms of its social and economical impact
- **Raise the demand for architectural design contests**

Number of design contests approved by the Slovak Chamber of Architects between 2007-2017 in Slovakia compared to Czech Republic



- Encouraging of the knowledge based economy and creative (higher added value) part of the building industry
- growths in the new jobs in the sector of the architectural and engineering professions
- higher demand for graduates of the architectural schools
- **initiation of discussion about the state organization of the architectural science and research**

1992 Establishment of the Slovak Chamber of Architects


2015 1st draft of Architectural policy developed by the Slovak Chamber of Architects (SCA)

December 2016, State Secretary of the Ministry of Transport and Construction of SR raised interest in the Architectural Policy introduced by Chamber of architects

March 2017, 2nd version of the Architectural Policy and establishment of the inter-ministerial work group under the gesture of (SCA)

May - June 2017, Ministry of Education, Culture, Transport and Construction, Inner Affairs and Economy involved in the work group under the gesture of (SCA)

The state of governmental implementation of Slovak Architectural policy



November 2017, 3th version of the Architectural Policy and meeting of the inter-ministerial WG

February 2018, 4th version of the Architectural policy

Final language editing and legal scrubbing

Next step:

Submit Architectural policy to the Ministry of Transport and Construction of the Slovak Republic and subsequently by the Ministry to the Government

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- policy high level paper establishing framework, ground for more specific implementation
